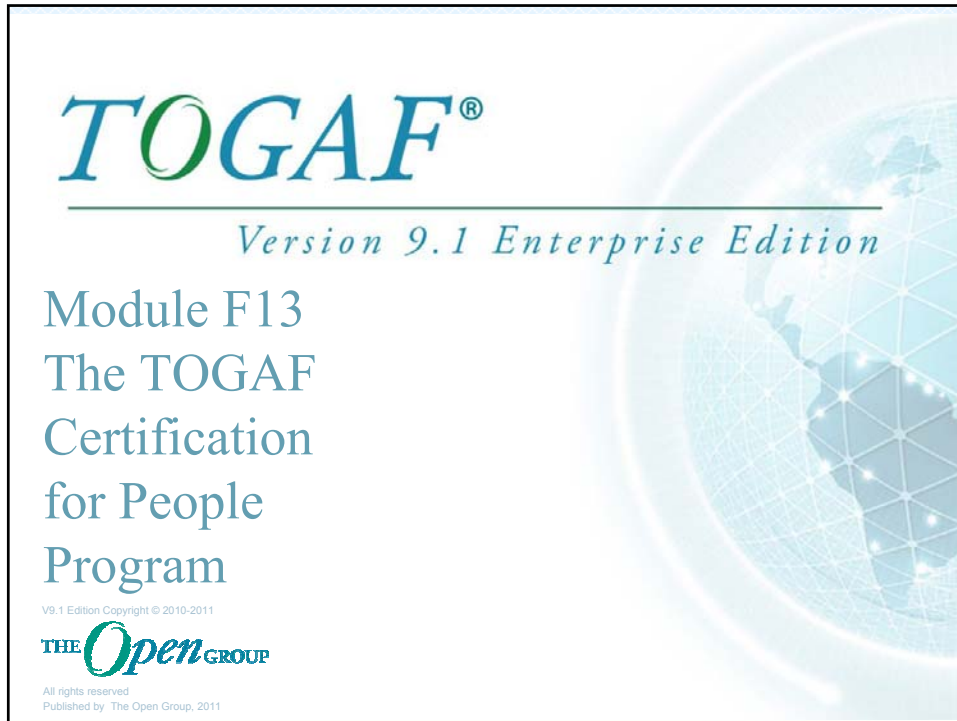



### TOGAF 9 Certification Levels


Level	Tag	Purpose
1	<i>TOGAF 9 Foundation</i>	To provide validation that the candidate has gained knowledge of the terminology and basic concepts of TOGAF 9 and understands the core principles of Enterprise Architecture and TOGAF
2	<i>TOGAF 9 Certified</i>	To provide validation that in addition to knowledge and comprehension, the candidate is able to analyze and apply knowledge of TOGAF

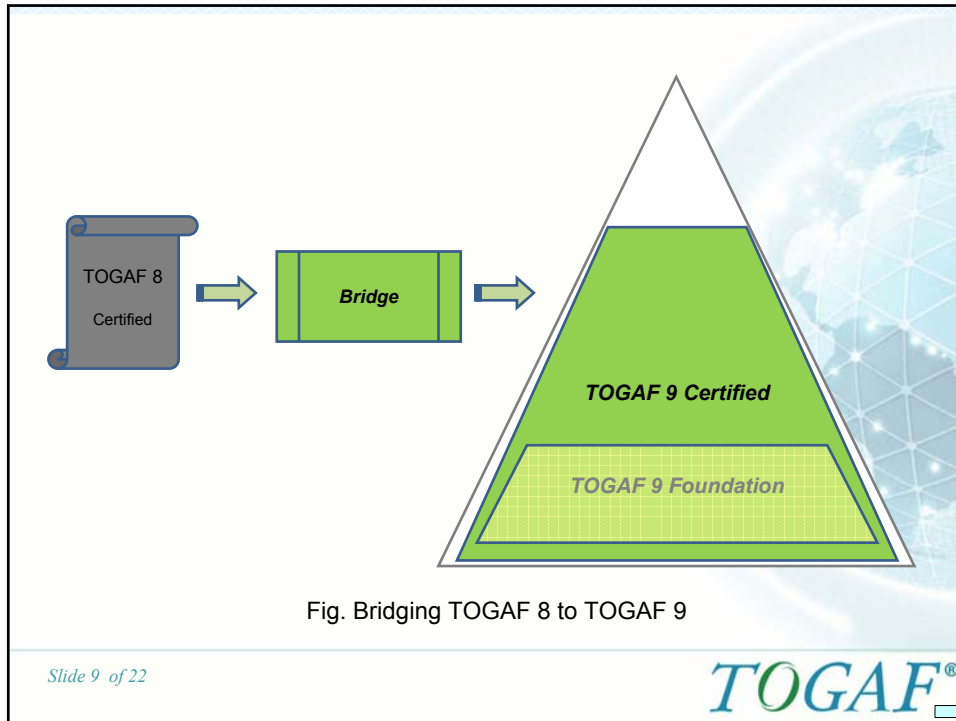
## *Level 2 – TOGAF 9 Certified* Target Audience

- Architects who want to achieve a recognized qualification to demonstrate their detailed knowledge of TOGAF 9.

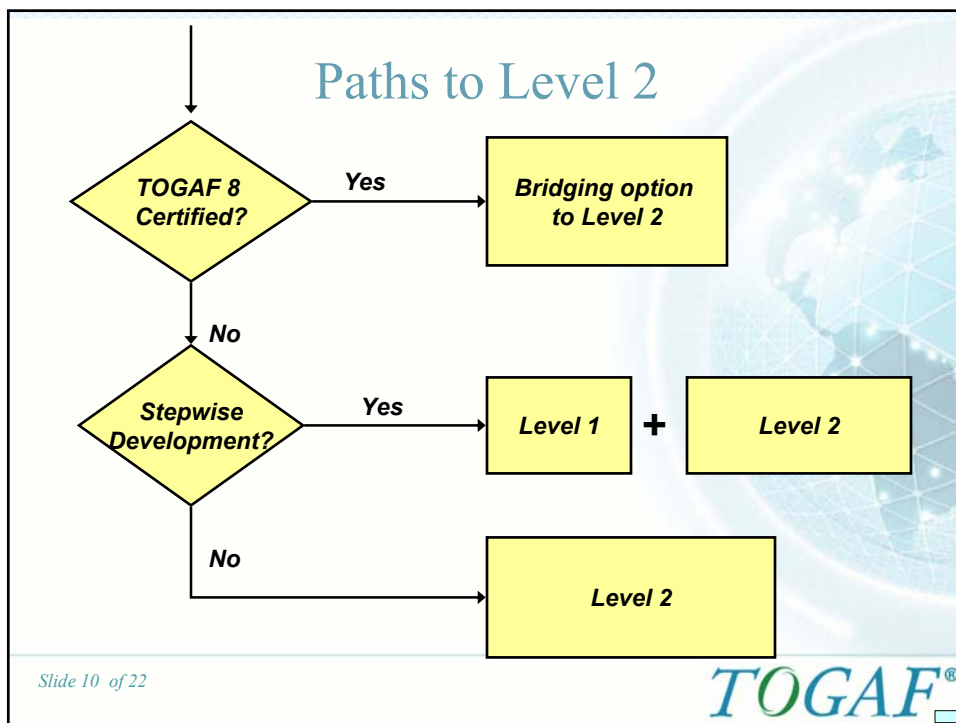

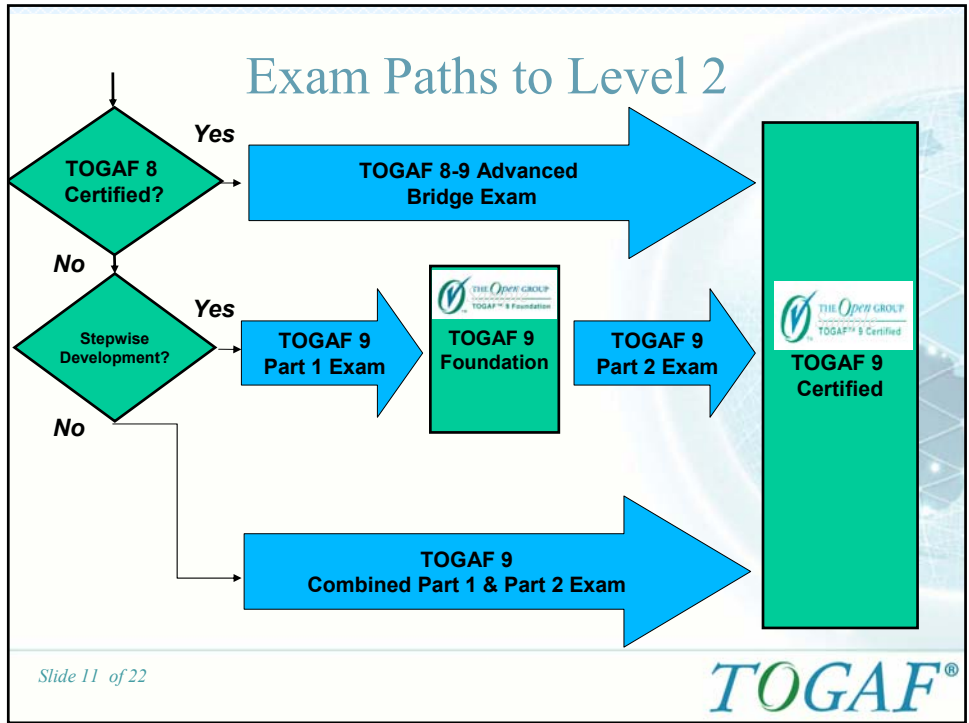

## Level 2 Exam Requirements

Level	Tag	Requirements
2 <small>(for new candidates)</small>	<i>TOGAF 9 Certified</i>	<p><u>Either Stepwise Development:</u> Level 2 requires passing two examinations. Exam 1 is identical to the Level 1 examination (leads to TOGAF 9 Foundation as an intermediate step)</p> <p><u>Or Direct to Level 2:</u> Passing the single exam: TOGAF 9 Combined Part 1 and 2 (leads only to TOGAF 9 Certified)</p>
